# Using Start and End Dates When Searching for a Course or Program 



## Scenario 1

The course or program IS returned in a search because it started before the lookup window and hadn't yet ended; therefore, it is effective "as of" the start date of the lookup window.


Scenario 2
The course or program is NOT returned because it ended before the lookup window began.

$\times$ Scenario 3
The course or program is NOT returned because it started and ended after the lookup window.


Scenario 4
The course or program is NOT returned because it started after the beginning of the lookup window.


Scenario 5
The course or program is NOT returned because it ended after the lookup window.

## Using Start and End Dates

## When Adding a Course as a Program Requirement



Scenario 6
The course WILL be accessible in the program requirements/degree map, since it begins before the program and its effectiveEnd is before the program's.


Scenario 7
The course WILL be accessible in the program requirements/degree map, since it begins before the program and its effectiveEnd is the same as the program's.


Scenario 8
The course WILL NOT be accessible in the program requirements/degree map, since its effectiveEnd is later than the effective end of the program.


Scenario 9
The course WILL NOT be accessible in the program requirements/degree map, since the course's effectiveEnd is after the program's.


Scenario 10
Regardless of the end date filter, the course will NOT be accessible in the program's requirements / degree maps, since the course's effective start date is after the program's effective start date.

Using Start and End Dates
When Determining What Will Appear in Your Catalog


Scenario 11
The course WILL be pulled into the catalog because they have the same effective start and end dates.



Scenario 12
The course WILL be pulled into the catalog because they have the same effective start date and the course's effective end date is before the catalog's.


Scenario 13
The course WILL NOT be pulled into the catalog because the course's end date is after the catalog's.


Scenario 14
The course WILL be pulled into the catalog because it starts before the catalog and ends the same day as the catalog.


## Scenario 15

The course WILL NOT be pulled into the catalog because its effective end date is after the catalog's effective end date.


The course will NOT be pulled into the catalog since the course's effective start date is after the catalog's effective start date AND because its effective end date is after the catalog's.
